


#### 1. Overview

The 47th Annual Meeting of the European Society for Clinical Investigation was held in the picturesque city of Albufeira, in sunny southern Portugal, from April 17 to 20, 2013.


A total of 332 participants registered in the meeting, with 91% of them showing up. The Phagocyte (100-120 people in average per session) and the Mitochondrial workshop (40-60 people in average per session) had the highest number of participants.



Regarding the origin of the participants, we were surprised by the multiplicity of countries represented. Portugal, as expected, had the largest contingent (68 participants), with Germany and Italy following. It must be stressed the emergence of Eastern Europe countries such as Hungary, Poland, Ukraine and Armenia or non-European countries such as China, Canada or Israel.



As for the type of registration, it must be praised the very high number of students (a third of all participants), which gave a colourful and youthful environment to the meeting. What was disappointing was the number of ESCI members that attended the meeting, which was lower than the number of non-ESCI members.



#### 2. Meeting venue

The meeting was organized at the five-star hotel CS São Rafael Atlantic, an excellent venue for these types of meeting. The hotel was close to the beach and had all the necessary amenities for all participants, including fitness room and spa, large rooms, a large auditorium and several smaller rooms, as well as a foyer area to organize the ESCI and registration desk, as well to potentiate interactions between participants and sponsors.








## 3. Opening session

The opening session of the meeting was a mix of social and scientific events, with two important highlights: the plenary opening talk by Dr. Anthony Shapira (UK) and the performance by the Fado of Coimbra group, Tertúlia Bairradina, which was highly praised. The opening session also had the presence of the Mayor of the City of Albufeira, José Carlos Rolo and also a introductory note about the history of the city.







A welcome reception followed the opening session, where participants could interact for the first time in the meeting in a very informal manner.




#### 4. Plenary sessions.

These lectures included the ESCI Award Winner 2013 for Basic/Translational Research, Luca Scorrano, the Award Winner 2013 for Clinical Research Mihai Netea and the awardee of the Albert Struyvenberg Medal, Gema Fruhbeck. The other three plenary lectures were from Gerard Pasterkamp, Brent Neuschwander-Tetri and Ira Tabas. All plenary lecture sessions had always a large attendance.












#### 5. Scientific sessions











#### 6. Poster sessions
